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## Electric base rate changes approved for 2019

On June 12, 2017, the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (MPUC) approved Xcel Energy's request for a 1.69 percent overall increase in rates for 2019 allowing for an incremental \$50.12 million increase in revenue as part of a Settlement Agreement in Xcel Energy's 2016 electric rate case. The rate increase is effective January 1, 2019.

### Changes for monthly electric base rates

New rates for electric service begin January 1, 2019. This chart (top/right) shows the current average monthly bill for a customer receiving each type of service and the average monthly rate increase for 2019.

How the changes affect your individual monthly bill will vary depending on the amount of electricity you use. Your monthly bill will also vary due to changes in the cost of fuel Xcel Energy purchases to generate electricity for your use. The amount you are charged for fuel cost is the same amount Xcel Energy pays.

Residential customers will see a 2019 level increase in the base charge for energy usage per kWh from 10.582¢ to 10.815¢ during summer months and from 9.032¢ to 9.241¢ during other months (without electric space heating). There are no changes in the fixed monthly charge. The net impact of these changes is an average 1.58 percent overall bill increase from current rates for Residential customers.
