

**NOTICE OF A CHANGE IN THE ELECTRIC RATES OF
PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF COLORADO
1800 LARIMER STREET, DENVER, COLORADO 80202**

You are hereby notified that Public Service Company of Colorado (“Public Service” or the “Company”) has filed with the Colorado Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”), in compliance with the Public Utilities Law, an advice letter seeking approval to implement Secondary Voltage Time-Of-Use Electric Vehicle Service “Schedule S-EV” in the Company’s Colorado P.U.C. No. 8 - Electric tariff, requested to become effective June 24, 2019. The Company’s Schedule S-EV is an optional service for commercial and industrial customers currently served under Schedules SG or SG-L to purchase electric service for the purpose of charging electric vehicles. This rate applies to commercial fleets, charging stations, and certain multi-unit dwellings. Under this service eligible customers may use the electrical service purchased to charge the customers’ owned, leased or otherwise beneficially used electric vehicles or may charge electric vehicles that are owned, leased or otherwise beneficially used by a third party, and charge a fee for such third party charging, with the tariff providing for the following charges:

In accordance with Rule 1210(a) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, copies of the proposed Schedule S-EV summarized above and as filed with the Commission, are available for examination and explanation at the Company’s main office, 1800 Larimer Street, Suite 1400, Denver, Colorado 80202-5533, or at the Commission’s office, 1560 Broadway, Suite 250, Denver, Colorado, 80202-5143. Anyone who desires may file written objection to the proposed action. Written comments or objections shall be filed with the Commission, 1560 Broadway, Suite 250, Denver, Colorado, 80202-5143 or e-mailed to: dora.state.co.us/pacific/PUC/puccomments on or before 10 days before the proposed effective date of June 24, 2019, or later should the Commission set this matter for hearing and suspend and delay the effective date of the request. The Commission may hold a hearing to determine what rates, rules and regulations will be authorized. If a hearing is held, the Commission may suspend the proposed rates, rules or regulations, and the Company requests a January 1, 2020 effective date in the event of a suspension, or sooner if the Commission so directs. The rates, rules and regulations ultimately authorized by the Commission may or may not be the same as those proposed, and may include rates that are higher or lower. The Commission will consider all written comments and objections submitted prior to the evidentiary hearing on the proposed action, if held. The filing of written comments or objections by itself will not allow you to participate as a party in any proceeding on the proposed action. If you wish to participate as a party in this matter, you must file written intervention documents in accordance with Rule 1401 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure or any applicable Commission order.

The Commission may hold a public hearing in addition to an evidentiary hearing on the proposed action and that if such a hearing is held, members of the public may attend and make statements even if they did not file comments, objections or an intervention. If the proposed

action is uncontested or unopposed, the Commission may determine the matter without a hearing and without further notice. Anyone desiring information regarding if and when a hearing may be held, shall submit a written request to the Commission or, alternatively, shall contact the External Affairs section of the Commission at 303-894-2070 or 1-800-456-0858. Notices of proposed hearings will be available on the Commission website under “News Releases” or through the Commission’s e-filing system.
