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The principal proposed change is to implement the Resiliency Service Program Tariff (“Schedule RSP”) in the Company’s Colorado P.U.C. No. 8 – Electric tariff, as reflected in the attached tariff sheets. As discussed in the supporting testimony, Schedule RSP is an optional service for Small Commercial or Commercial and Industrial Secondary, Primary or Transmission Service customers who take service from a single metering point that have a need for higher than standard service reliability through use of battery energy storage or on-site generation assets. The purpose of Schedule RSP is to provide resiliency services to customers through Company ownership and operations of resiliency service assets behind a customer’s meter. The resiliency service assets are the assets that will be owned, operated, and maintained by the Company on the customer’s behalf. Resiliency service assets can consist of battery energy storage systems, generation assets, switching and control equipment, or some combination of these.

The effect on the Company’s revenues cannot be determined at this time and will be dependent upon the number of customers who elect to participate. Non-participating customers’ electric bills will not be impacted by this filing. Costs to customers electing to participate in Schedule RSP will be determined on a case-by-case basis per each customer’s specific needs as explained in the supporting testimony. Customers must sign a customer service agreement (“CSA”) prior to taking service from this tariff. The CSA identifies the resiliency service assets to be provided, describes the agreed operation and maintenance of resiliency service assets being provided to customers, and associated charges.

In addition to posting the Notice on the Company’s website and keeping it open for public inspection, notice of this filing will be placed in the Legal Classified section of the Denver Post once during the first twenty days of the thirty-day period prior to the effective date of the proposed tariff revisions. Contemporaneously filed with this Advice Letter, the Company is filing a Motion for an Alternative Form of Notice seeking authority to provide notice of the filing as set forth in this paragraph. A copy of the notice is attached to the Motion for Alternative Form of Notice.

It is desired that the changed tariff/tariffs accompanying this Advice Letter become effective on April 24, 2022.

In support of this filing, the Company is also filing the Direct Testimony and attachments of two witnesses.
