## NOTICE OF PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF COLORADO 1800 LARIMER STREET, DENVER, COLORADO 80202-5533 TO REVISE ITS SCHEDULE OF CHARGES FOR RENDERING SERVICE

You are hereby notified that Public Service Company of Colorado ("Public Service" or the "Company") has filed with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of Colorado ("Commission") Advice No. 1950 – Electric to revise its Schedule of Charges for Rendering Service in its Colorado P.U.C. No. 8 – Electric tariff ("Electric Tariff") to become effective on June 14, 2024.

The proposed change is to add a charge for remote connections and reconnections for customers that have Advanced Metering Infrastructure meters ("Advanced Meters"). The newly added reconnection charge for Advanced Meters will reflect the actual cost to provide remote connection and reconnection of electric service for customers. The Company does not charge customers for disconnections, so there is no need to add a remote disconnection charge. Currently, all customers are subject to the same electric service reconnection charges, which are \$49 if reconnected in 24 hours or \$92 if reconnected in 12 hours. Once a residential or commercial non-demand customer receives an Advanced Meter with the internal service switch that enables remote disconnection and reconnection, the reconnection charge will decrease to just \$6.00. This will result in a decrease of \$43 to \$86 for an electric service reconnection. Combined gas and electric customers that have Advanced Meters and require gas and electric service to be reconnected will be assessed the \$6.00 electric service reconnection charge plus the gas reconnection charge as indicated in the Colorado Gas P.U.C. No. 6 - Gas Tariff.

There is no revenue impact for this filing because the revenues offset the costs incurred to provide the charge for rendering service.

Anyone who desires may file written comments or objections to the proposed action. The Commission will consider all written comments and objections submitted prior to the evidentiary hearing on the filing if one is to occur. The filing of written comments or objections by itself will not allow you to participate as a party in any proceeding on the proposed action. If you wish to participate as a party in this matter, you must file written intervention documents in accordance with Rule 1401 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure or any applicable Commission order.

The Commission may hold a hearing to determine what rates, rules and regulations will be authorized. If a hearing is held, the Commission may suspend the proposed rates, rules or regulations. The rates, rules and regulations ultimately authorized by the Commission may or may not be the same as those proposed and may include rates that are higher or lower.

The Commission may hold a public hearing in addition to an evidentiary hearing on the filing. If such a public hearing is held, members of the public may attend and make statements even if they did not file comments, objections or interventions. If the filing is uncontested or unopposed, the Commission may determine the matter without hearing and without further notice.
