The accompanying tariff sheets issued by Public Service Company of Colorado ("Public Service" or the "Company") are sent to you for filing in accordance with the requirements of the Public Utilities Law:

The principal proposed change is: to decrease the Company's Clean Air Clean Jobs Act ("CACJA") rider, applicable to all electric base rate schedules in the Company's Colorado P.U.C. No. 8 - Electric tariff, reflected in the attached tariff sheets, to become effective May 1, 2018. This revision accounts for the changes due to the passing of the Federal Tax Cut and Jobs Act ("TCJA") in December 2017.

On December 22, 2017, the TCJA was signed, which enacts a material reduction in the United States federal corporate income tax rate from 35 percent to 21 percent. For regulated electric and natural gas utilities, the TCJA also requires the reevaluation of federal deferred tax assets and liabilities and bonus depreciation due to the lower tax rate. With this Advice No. 1764 - Electric the Company is decreasing the CACJA to reflect the estimated impacts of the TCJA on this rider.

The calculation of the impact is based on the 2018 CACJA estimated revenue requirement, as revised to reflect the Company's estimate of the TCJA net impact for the entire 2018 calendar year. The net impact is a reduction to the revenue requirement of \$9,040,398. The calculation has been attached to this Advice Letter as Exhibit 1.

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Through the normal Commission approved CACJA rider true-up process (per Decision No. C15-0292, in Proceeding No. 14AL-0660E), the Company will ultimately present the actual total 2018 CACJA revenue requirement. This revenue requirement will include the actual 2018 impacts of the TCJA approved by the Commission. The difference between the actual 2018 revenue requirement and the revenue collected through the CACJA in 2018 will be identified in the Company's November 2019 CACJA rate adjustment filing and reflected in the CACJA rates effective in 2020.

The Company has worked with stakeholders to ensure the benefits of TCJA are flowed back to customers. This proposed decrease provides an immediate rate reduction based on a preliminary estimate of the impacts of TCJA on the CACJA rider to customers, subject a subsequent true-up filing.

The revised CACJA reflects a decrease of \$0.00061, from \$0.00348 to \$0.00287, per kWh for residential customers, and a \$0.00053 decrease, from \$0.00314 to \$0.00261, per kWh for small commercial customers.

This filing would decrease the Company's annual electric revenues by \$9,040,398 based on the twelve-month period ending December 31, 2018.

Pursuant to the Motion for Alternative Form of Notice filed with the Commission contemporaneously herewith, the Company plans to provide notice of this filing by causing it to be published in *The Denver Post* for two consecutive weeks starting on Saturday, March 31, 2018. A copy of the proposed notice is attached to this Advice Letter as Exhibit 2.

The projected impacts of the Company's filing on typical monthly bills for 2018 are shown below.

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Contemporaneously filed with this advice letter is Advice No. 1763 - Electric, in which the Company is requesting approval to decrease the Transmission Cost Adjustment ("TCA") to reflect the estimated impacts of the TCJA. The table below provides the cumulative customer bill impacts attributable to the decreases to both the TCA and CACJA riders.
