



Residential Resiliency and Managed Charging Project **60-Day Notice Summary Report**

On October 29, 2021, Public Service Company of Colorado (“Public Service” or “the Company”) issued a 60-Day Notice (“Notice”) to update stakeholders regarding the Company’s development of a Residential Resiliency and Managed Charging Project be incorporated into the Company’s 2021-2023 Transportation Electrification Plan (“TEP”) as approved by the Colorado Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) through Decision No. C21-0017 in Proceeding No. 20A-0204E.
