Application review process

Upon submission of your application, Xcel Energy may contact you for additional information. Based upon the process outlined in the updated 60-Day Notice: Identifying Higher Emissions Communities, approximately 30 days after the application period closes, Xcel Energy will post a 60-Day Notice with its proposed decision on any new Higher Emissions Communities. External comments through the 60-Day Notice Process will be due 30 days following the posting of the notice. Xcel Energy will then issue a final decision approximately 30 days following the closing of the external comment period. Xcel Energy will inform applicants about the addition of any new Higher Emissions Communities and any new program eligibility for respective projects approximately 90 days after the submission of their application.

² For reference purposes only, Colorado House Bill 21-1266 established income criteria as a community with greater than 40% of households are designated as having low income. Public Service Company of Colorado uses various income criteria for certain programs in its Transportation Electrification Plan, including being located in a county or census block where 50% or more of households have incomes at or below 80% of Area Median Income or meeting the income qualifications for the multifamily or federal weatherization programs.
